Historic District Update

Historic character makes the town a distinctive and appealing place for visitors and businesses.

The downtown historic district protects over 150 buildings.

Historic Tax Credits can offset up to 40% of the cost of renovation!

Before starting construction on a historic building, check with Town staff about required permits and compliance with all state laws and local ordinances.



Comprehensive Plan draft ready

Required by state law, this 80-page plan tracks community data and shares a vision for preserving small-town character improving the quality of life for all. Town Council hopes to adopt this plan soon. Read the full plan on the Town website and share ideas! Here are some key points:

- Town population is about 600.
- Daily traffic on Rte 20 is about 7,400.
- The town has 147 owner-occupied homes and 101 homes rented.
- Restaurants are the largest employers in town, but only a few town residents also work in town.
- 60% of the town residents who have jobs go north to C-ville and throughout Albemarle County
- Albemarle County is likely to grow from 106,000 to 140,000 residents by 2040. For Scottsville, the plan calls for 1,000 residents by 2040.

Future Land Use: This map from the draft Comprehensive Plan shows a focus on redeveloping the vacant factory site (purple). The rest of town generally keeps its existing look and feel.
