## MINUTES

1. CALL TO ORDER – Mayor R. Stephen Phipps called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG
3. ROLL CALL of Town Council – Clerk of Council Amy Moyer called the roll. Ms. Copeland, Mr. O'Halloran, Mr. Stratton, and Mr. Svetich were present; absent were Mr. Hogan and Ms. Kerlin. Also in attendance were Town Administrator Barry Clark and two observers.

Upon a motion by Mr. Svetich, seconded by Ms. Copeland, the consent calendar was approved by voice vote.

### 5. MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor Phipps expressed appreciation for the Adopt-a-Highway trash pickup by the Lions Club. He also thanked the Fire Department for organizing the Fourth of July parade and fireworks. He reported that the Rivanna Garden Club is organizing a week-long event to be held in Scottsville in 2007. Mayor Phipps asked community members to voice their opinions on renaming Scottsville Elementary School in honor of former principal Thomas Allison. He also reported that the James River Pipeline is still under consideration.

6. PUBLIC FORUM – No one from the public rose to speak.
7. APPROPRIATION OF \$1,000 FOR TOURISM PROMOTION AT MONTICELLO VISITORS CENTER

Mr. Svetich moved to appropriate \$1,000 for a tourism promotion at Monticello Visitors Center. Mr. Stratton seconded the motion, and a roll-call vote ensued.

*Planning Commission:* Mr. Svetich reported that the Planning Commission discussed the High Meadows property at the July 5 meeting. Harrison Rue planned to attend the August meeting.

*Public Safety, Traffic, and Infrastructure Committee:* Mr. Stratton reported that bluegrass festival organizational meetings have been going well; admission is free for volunteers who work four hours. His committee discussed the Fourth of July events, as well as a new parade route for next year. Mr. Stratton also reported that neighbors seem to be working well together to remedy ATV noise complaints.

*Tourism Committee:* Mr. O'Halloran thanked those who helped with the Fourth of July T-shirts, noting that a few are left for sale now and next year. The Tourism Committee next meets on August 9.

*Quality of Life Committee:* Mayor Phipps reported that Sprint finally submitted its plans to VDOT.

*Historic Preservation Committee:* Ms. Copeland reported on the recent Architecture in Action and Country Stores exhibits. She noted that fundraising efforts continue for the architectural inventory/history publication.

#### 9. TOWN ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Mr. Clark reported that the any holes from the gas line relocation would be repaved in the next few weeks; the new gas lines were laid with copper wire to be easily located in the future.
